The proposed project structure for the Ohio Health Information Technology (OHHIT) project marries well with the required project structure for the Health Information Security and Privacy Contract (HISPC). The Health Information Community of Ohio (HICO) Advisory Group is a formalized representation of the stakeholder community. Both projects require a steering committee to oversee the projects and should use the same committee to avoid redundancy and confusion. The State Implementation Plan Working Group can handle issues of governance and financing, as well as other implementation planning work. The State Variations Working Group can look at adoption issues that go beyond simply focusing on privacy and security issues. Both projects require a legal working group. The State Solutions Working Group must focus on technical and non-technical solutions issues and can look at solutions to all proposed adoption challenges and priority initiatives. Both projects identify the value in using ad hoc groups, with the OHHIT project specifying consumers as one, critical focus for a group.
